First, at 1741 from 1968 - 1977. Then, at 1765 from 1989 to the present. Her two sons, Christopher & Timothy, reside in the house now. Carol served as cluster treasurer from 1990-1996, after which she turned the job over to her husband, Dick, upon his retirement. Carol, along with Ruth Ruttenberg, developed the computer systems for the cluster which were used while she & Dick were treasurer. A memorial service was held at the Rose gallery on Lake Anne on June 22. Her ashes will be spread at her family burial site in Fayette County, WV at a 2nd service this Summer. Carol wanted a bench built and placed there so family members will have a place to sit. A granite bench is being made and we will convene when it is ready, probably in August. She was the youngest of six and the last to die. In typical WV fashion, the cemetery is on the side of a hill.
